Foreword to the Foreword (2022):

I am so glad that back in 1993 I put this book together, and others have expressed appreciation for it, too. Many of these songs are not easily found, even on the Internet, and even then, we had our own versions of them anyway. AFAIK the campfire song cards are long gone, and we did not have the chords written down.

My only regret was that, for some reason, I typed these all out in all caps. So this summer I changed that. As well I took the opportunity to make some chord corrections, which I've noted. I stuck with Courier New, because I wanted to preserve the page layout of the 1993 version, which became challenging with a different font. I stuck with all the practices listed below in the rather wordy original Foreword.

Because I had this book, I was able to sing many of these songs to Millie in her final months in long-term care. She often requested the Camp Song twice!

Foreword (1993):

This book is long overdue. Two developments have aided in its completion. (Of course, as we are always learning songs, it will never be complete). The first development was acquiring a computer, which greatly simplified the task. The other was the Camp's purchase of a copyright licence which allows us to copy this material in such a way that songwriters are given proper recognition and receive the benefits due their labours. Not all of our information is complete, but we're making progress and we ask that you honour our efforts and not reproduce this book.

I (RP) have not always been consistent in my musical notation, but I will try to explain here some of its general principles:

Chord symbols are placed right over the syllable where the change occurs. Sometimes the change occurs (due to syncopation) just before or after a word and I've tried to depict that. Other times I just couldn't fit the symbol at the right place. Sometimes I've put the first chord on the first beat of the first bar and sometimes I've put it over the pickup notes. I just couldn't decide.

I haven't used a lot of 7th chords (especially dominant 7ths). I'm trusting that you know when they are appropriate. If you play what I've written, it will work, but you may prefer the 7th.

Small letters refer to single notes (usually bass notes). B flat is represented by "bb". Occasionally, I've shown notes for the bass using " / ". "Am/G" means A minor with a g bass note. " /F#" means the previously mentioned chord with an f# bass note.

"C(Em)" means you may play Em instead of C. "C (Em)" means you may play Em AFTER C, if you wish. If not, keep playing C. I've tried to include all the songs we have on cards and on overheads, including Christmas carols and action songs. (The latter two are grouped separately) [and not included in this edition]. Some songs that occupy a card or overhead by themselves are grouped with another song, but songs that share an overhead I've tried to put on the same page.

In order to play many of these songs as written here, you will have to know barre chords. If you don't, now would be a good time to learn. They will serve you well. This book represents the way I play these songs (Sept. '93), not necessarily the way they were written or the way I learned them (many from Monty Parks--Thank you, Monty). The keys chosen are the ones I prefer and innovations regarding intros and endings are certainly not sacred.

If you are playing along with me, I will probably play them this way. If you are filling in for me temporarily it would probably be best to follow my recommendations, as that's what people are currently used to. If you are replacing me (!), love God and do what you want.
